



# Family Trail 2021



**Welcome to our book trail! You are looking for 10 little boxes. Our logo is on the front so you'll know it's part of our trail and if you lift the lid, inside you'll discover an image related to one of our festival authors or illustrators. Each box also has a self-inking letter stamper for you to stamp this page. When you have completed the walk, you should have the letters to make up a word related to the festival. If you return to the Mini-Marquee with your completed form, you can choose to be entered into a draw to win our prize hamper! And if you follow us on Instagram and tag us in a photo from the trail, you'll get an extra entry too!**



The walk starts from the Mini Marquee on The Green; the boxes are along this route they are all painted green. Please leave them as you find them for the enjoyment of others. Head away from the marquee and carefully cross the road in front of the Public Hall. Turn right and walk along the pavement towards the traffic lights. You will soon reach the library – the first box is outside here!



Take the small footpath that goes down the side of the library. At the end of the path, carefully cross the road, the second box is on the bank outside the entrance to St Peter's Church (please don't obstruct the entrance for anyone attending the church services).



Cross the road next to the church walking past the bakery. Turn left onto the high street and walk down as far as The Rowan Tree shop, taking care when crossing side roads. Carefully cross the main road and continue to walk down the high street. Walk all the way to the end of the shops and at the corner by The Old Clink building, carefully cross the road again to reach The Fairlynch Museum. The third box is in the beautiful garden here. If you have time, stop for a look inside this fascinating museum on the local area.



Cross back again and continue towards the sea front. At the end of the buildings, turn right at Raleigh's Wall (made famous by Victorian Pre-Raphaelite painter Sir John Edward Millais in his painting). Cross the concrete parking area, the fourth box is here.



Turn right along the path that skirts the edge of the beach. Follow this path as it climbs the cliff, eventually passing the toilet block on your right. Continue up the hill, there are two boxes along here. Box five is shortly after the toilet block, box six is as you reach the junction with Cliff Road. (You'll need to keep your eyes peeled for these two!)



Turn into Cliff Road and follow it all the way to the bottom. Turn left at The Feathers pub, you are now back on the High Street. Cross the High Street at the traffic lights to take the road back towards the Green. Cross the road opposite the Public Hall. Once back at The Green, take the steps leading away from the marquees up the hill. Box seven is at the top of this path.



Follow the path into the corner past the hedge as it emerges onto the open area. Take the path along the top of the Green to find box eight near the bench.



Continue along the path to find box number nine by the small tree near the path junction.



Box number ten can be found by the bandstand/covered benches- you can follow the paths or make a run for it over the grass!

Bring your completed trail back to the Mini Marquee with the word you discovered and your details filled in to be entered into the draw for our PRIZE HAMPER!
